Chicagoland FSHD Family Day Conference Speaker Bios

Leah Hanson graduated from St. Ambrose University with a BA in Psychology and MS in Occupational Therapy. Leah has worked at the Pain Management Center at Shirley Ryan Abilitylab for the past four years. She has a background and special interest in community mental health occupational therapy rehabilitation. Leah is currently leading a program redesign project at the Pain Management Center and enjoys participating in student education and community education regarding chronic pain management.

Don McGovern, CPO, FAAOP, is a certified and licensed orthotist prosthetist at the Shirley Ryan Abilitylab. A Fellow of the American Academy of Orthotists and Prosthetists, he has practiced for forty years in several Chicago settings including medical centers and private practice.

Charulatha Nagar, MD, is a neurologist at the Northwestern Feinberg School of Medicine, with a specific focus on neuropathies, muscle disorders, myasthenia gravis, neurotoxins in medical therapeutics, clinical trials, and medical education. She received her MD from JSS Medical College in India, did her neurology residency at Loyola University Medical Center, and was a Fellow in neuromuscular disorders and clinical electromyography at Washington University in St Louis, Barnes Jewish Hospital.

Alejandro Rojas, PhD, is a principal scientist at Fulcrum Therapeutics. Dr. Rojas has been an instrumental member of the Fulcrum team that screened and validated drug candidates for treating FSHD, resulting in the identification of losmapimod as a promising therapeutic which is now in a phase 2b clinical trial. Dr. Rojas earned his doctorate in the renowned laboratory of Danny Reinberg at the New York University Langone Medical Center.

Joy Wagner, BSN, founder and president, Neurobalance Center. Wagner received a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) from the University of Iowa. She was diagnosed with MS in 2001, which led her to concentrate her energies on quality of life for those living with neuromuscular and autoimmune conditions. Joy saw the isolation and depression in the individuals she was working with, and launched an adaptive fitness and rehabilitation program. The program quickly attracted people with many other chronic conditions that threaten independence, including Parkinson's, stroke, epilepsy, ALS, muscular dystrophy, and myasthenia gravis. By 2010, fitMS had evolved into the NeuroBalance Center, a 501(c)3 charity providing chiropractic, functional medicine, physical/occupational therapy, acupuncture, adaptive personal training, massage, infusion services, and educational programs. NeuroBalance Center is headquartered in Barrington, IL in a state-of-the-art fitness and rehabilitation center.

Lindsay Wallace, PhD, is currently a Research Scientist with the Harper Lab, in the Center for Gene Therapy at the Abigail Wexner Research Institute at Nationwide Children's Hospital, in Columbus, Ohio. She received a bachelor's degree in microbiology from Miami University in 2005 and her PhD in molecular, cellular and developmental biology from The Ohio State University in 2012. Since joining Dr Scott Harper in 2009, she has been dedicated to understanding the disease mechanisms of FSHD and developing gene therapy approaches for treatment.
